- Semayr Sire Proving Team heifers will still be classified free of charge as per the existing conditions
- Members who hold a Paid Life membership will still be required to pay the TOP Herd Fees as prescribed

#### **Forward Star & Production Star**

#### **Production Star**

Production Star is a programme designed to find the best producing cows in each herd and breed to the best sires available. Farmers were given a selection criteria which was stated in the entry form.

Eligibility: First and second lactation animals must perform within the top 20% of their age group in all of the following criteria. Three or more lactation animals must perform within the top 20% of the whole herd in all of the following criteria.

Criteria:

Protein kg

Fat kg

Volume L

SCC (bottom 20%)

Classes:

First lactation

Second lactation

Three or more lactations

Production information must be obtained from a Trait Evaluation Report available from LIC in excel format. Alternatively use Minda Custom Report (PW primary sort descending, LW secondary sort descending). Three Generation Pedigrees are to be included with every entered animal. Animals entered will need a TOP score and preferably 7-7 or greater.

# **Forward Star**

Currently there is no genomic data available for NZ Ayrshire animals therefore a programme was put in place to fast track young female genetics. The programme is designed to try and find the most eligible young females that will become superior in-milk animals and breed to the best sires available. Farmers were given a selection criteria which was stated in the entry form.

Vision: To improve the genetic advancement of the Ayrshire Breed via young female progeny.

Functionality: The successful 2019 born heifers will be analysed and given recommended matings by Semayr. The male progeny will be considered for the Sire Proving Scheme. The female progeny will be considered for the next Forward Star intake.

Eligibility: The rising one year old heifers must have BVs of no less than, 6 out of 7 of the following criteria. Somatic Cell Count must not be above the BV criteria.

Criteria BV:
Protein Kg: 8
Fat Kg: 2
Milk: 250
Fertility -4.0
Total Long: 50
SCC: -0.10
UO: 0.10

Criteria information can be obtained from a Trait Evaluation Report from your LIC area manager in Excel Format.

Alternatively use Minda Custom Report (PW primary sort descending, LW secondary sort descending). Three Generation Pedigrees are to be included with every entered animal.

- 1. Production records shall be those of the preceding season using 305 day lactation records.
- 2. Scales used for Mature Equivalent (ME) points: 2 yrs 30%, 3 yrs 21%, 4 yrs 11%, 10 yrs & over 10%.
- 3. Type points to be:- Udder overall plus Dairy Conformation times 6 (UO + DC  $\times$  6). Not classified 72 points. Classification to be the current figures when record produced.
- 4. Owners milking 15 or more daughters of a sire that qualify shall enter in the 10 daughter competition. Owners milking 14 or less daughters of a sire that qualify shall enter in the 5 daughter competition.
- 5. Only pedigree Ayrshire cows, S3A (ARA) and S2A (ARB) cows may be used in teams.
