

Top Performers of 2023

It is a pleasure to be highlighting the top performing animals registered with the Ayrshire Cattle Society of Great Britain & Ireland on Production, Type Classification, Brood Cow status and Show success. For those who are unaware the Ayrshire Cattle Society run two Herd Books. One being for Ayrshires (Breed code 03), the other being for British Red and Whites with less than 51% Ayrshire blood (Breed code 14).

PRODUCTION

During 2023 there were a total of 12,913 completed lactations with an average yield of 7,692kgs 4.22% butterfat and 3.32% protein. From the main Ayrshire Herd Book, there were 9,208 completed lactations, and from the Red and White Herd Book there were 3,705 completed lactations. For those animals who excel in their production of yield and reach a benchmark of quality of milk, whilst maintaining strong fertility, a Superior Production (SP) status is awarded. In 2023 a total of 531 Superior Production awards were achieved.



NEWSFLASH!

Gargus Jemima 3 EX97 8E and Troutbeck Burdette Jess 3 EX96 7E have recently officially been awarded their LP100 status in 2024. These cows are two of the highest classified animals still in production in the United Kingdom, and to have produced over 100,000kgs (220,000lbs) of lifetime yield, is testament to them being recognised as outstanding examples of the breed!

The Breed Heritage Programme

The Breed Heritage Committee would like to welcome members and friends from around the world to the United Kingdom and wish them a wonderful tour, making friends and creating memories.

All UK breed societies have an obligation and are required by the charities commission to protect and enhance their breed, by achieving maximum purity within its population to safeguard its future. At the same time, it should be mindful not to discriminate against breeders who introduce outside blood to breed an animal to suit their systems and businesses. The Ayrshire breed and its Society in the UK have created the opportunity to facilitate for all requirements for which the Society and its members should be commended on.

The Breed Heritage programme was introduced to fulfil the breed's obligations by identifying cow families which will make an impact on the future of the breed, and to assist in helping breeders with suggested breeding options for the next generation. The programme has achieved much success with many cow families over the years, but it does not come without its challenges.

Here we have answered some commonly asked questions to help you understand the work which the committee does, behind the scenes and we remind everyone that this project will certainly help us with future challenges within the industry.

How do Breed Heritage identify animals for the programme?

Many great families exist in the UK, and they all have much to offer. We are very fortunate to have a great data base in the UK where pedigrees can be located giving us a wealth of information on a cow families background and its current active data. The committee are dedicated to researching and gaining knowledge of families we should be considering. We also rely heavily on members to help us identify animals within their herds or those they know of, which may be of interest.

What are the required merits of an animal on the Breed Heritage programme?

We will consider its depth of pedigree, consistency, production, health traits, and type. It's important to understand how the animal performs within its own herd as production varies with different input systems in UK dairy herds. Genomic results are observed but its reliability is always noted. Minimal standards have been set regarding index and fertility.

Are the animals all pure Ayrshire on the programme?

Not at all. The aim is to bring many families lost to outside blood back to purity or as near as possible and we have many examples of success in this area. With cooperation from breeders, we have made significant gains in raising the percentage of Ayrshire blood in many families, both on the mainland and in Northern Ireland. We also must respect some breeder's requests to keep a little outside blood within their own families.

What are the criteria on sires for suggested matings?

Obviously, the gene pool is not huge in a small breed and with the high use of sexed semen, this will only become more of a challenge. We search for the highest production and component sires available from around the world and take into consideration their health and fertility status. We also check for haplotypes and recessives and consider inbreeding value. Outcross sires are often required but are limited. We do hope future Breed Heritage projects will expand our genetics available in the UK.

Do breeders always accept the suggested matings from Breed Heritage?

Not always. Some suggestions may not be accepted by the breeder, or the semen may not have been delivered on time, and sometimes in the past, the communication has been lost. We always explain the reasons and thoughts behind our suggestions and hope it is appreciated and taken on. We always continue to monitor these animals and record their progeny. We can never assume our suggestions made are the right ones, but what we can say is that we have taken the time, put in the thought, and suggested what we think is the best available choice. We give no guarantees!

What is the current situation with genomic selection?

As we all know this is a controversial subject regarding a breed with relatively low numbers. A base was formed several years ago, and it requires large numbers of females to be tested to increase the accuracy and reliability of the information it provides. Several questions must be raised regarding the current testing process and the interpretation of the results and Breed Heritage are working hard to ensure a more productive and relevant process. Currently, Breed Heritage will use genomic data for identifying haplotypes and for some information it provides, but we cannot rely on this information to make informed breeding decisions until we believe the system is relevant to our breed.

What are the biggest challenges you must deal with?

We have a list of these! As a small breed we have a small gene pool. Genomics will identify certain genetics as superior, but a good balance of genetic selection must be prioritised, or else all genetics will be of a similar breeding. The high use of Sexed semen has and will further limit the number of bulls born for future consideration. Breeder's responses can sometimes be delayed, and reliability of information is often low. However, no challenge is too big to get in the way with such a worthwhile project.

Are there any sires in AI because of previous Breed Heritage work?

We are proud to acknowledge our inputs have succeeded with Haresfoot Panache, Cuthill Towers Buster, Brieryside Hail, Biddesden Hector, Swaites Nickle, Gwynogg Primetime, Moathouse Monopoly, Whitecroft Panell, Grove Razell, and Ravenhill Revolver which have all come from past Breed Heritage suggested mating's.

Who are the Breed Heritage Committee?

Chairman is Michael Broadley (Whitecroft), with Colin Christophers (Rosehill), John Adamson (Swaites), Scott Taylor (Old Mill) and Robert McConnell (Beechmount) as committee members. The programme is managed by Duncan Hunter from Hunter Dairy Consulting, with Sam Wake from Cattle Services Ayr Ltd in attendance. It is a five-year term with one committee member retiring each year.

If there is one message to get across to Ayrshire breeders regarding the programme, what would that be?

Breeders' participation is paramount to the development and success of Breed Heritage and the breeds future prosperity. We rely on them to let us know of the animals they have for consideration. Feedback is necessary for accurate recording. We can gain access to much information but if there is an issue with a female on the programme i.e., Somatic Cell Counts or a trait weakness of negativity to the breed then honesty will help us all with future development. We must all be in this together, use the tools available to us, remember the influence of a cow family, use our eyes to see what is in front of us and above all keep breeding Ayrshire cattle!

Allocated time has been created to run the programme and we can assure you we do our very best to make it as successful as possible.

All potential sires are now genomically tested to determine any haplotypes and genetic recessives which is now an important part of the selection process.

In order to find the best genetics Cattle Services works closely with the Breed Heritage committee to identify the best cow families and plan breedings to hopefully produce bulls that can enter the program.

Over the last eight years, successful sires that have come from these matings include Cuthill Towers Buster, Biddesden Hector, Ravenhill Revolver and Hilltown Yukon Delta. Alongside this, Cattle Services also identify potential bull mothers, where we will work with the breeders to try and breed a potential future sire (although this usually ends up with a nice heifer calf being born!).

We have also been using embryos from some of the best UK cow families to try and breed potential bull mothers or future sires.





Cattle Services H.Q. Update

Currently, Cattle Services have two bulls on collection. Ravenhill Revolver has been our top selling bull since being released last December. Cuthill Towers Rhino will be the first sire to be released in 2024, he is a Troutbeck Progress son of Cuthill Towers Aladdin Rae 4 EX91 with his grand dam being a National Ayrshire Show Champion, Cuthill Towers Crown Ray EX96 (7E), who also has produced over 100 tonnes of milk. The Ray family at Cuthill Towers has consistently bred long lasting cows who combine type and production. Rhino himself is the highest PLI sire at Cattle Services with an exceptional score of £625 alongside predictions of 1428 kg of milk and 2.05 type merit. He will have a number of conventional straws available alongside high purity sexed ultra straws.

It is reassuring to see breeders across the world looking to include British genetics in their breeding programs.

At home, the show season is in full swing. At the UK Dairy Expo in March both the junior champion, Richaven Hail Lucky and reserve junior champion, Holmeswood Hail Bella where daughters of one of our top selling sires, Brieryside Hail. In the milking classes the champion was Morwick Peggy 126, a Pam Ayrs Hawaiian daughter, followed by Swaites Nice Girl 37 in reserve who is a daughter of Ardmore Jeepers Creepers. Morwick Peggy 126 also took Champion at Ayr Show in May. Elsewhere at the North Somerset Show the Supreme Dairy Champion was a Ravenhill Stormin Norman daughter - Greenway Thea.

As well as seeing these great results in the show ring, it also is pleasing to see and hear great reports on farms. Plaskett Bruno, Beeline Ladys Man and Beechmount Magic Mike continue to sire calves that stand out in the youngstock pens. In the milking parlours, Pam Ayrs Hawaiian daughters continue to impress. Two sires who received their first daughter proofs in April, Harperfield Wind in the Willows and Moathouse Monopoly, are siring some fantastic heifers with great mammary systems.

The upcoming World Conference visits will give breeders a great excuse to get on farm and see progeny of Cattle Services bulls, if there are visits within your area please come and have a look, you will be impressed. Young Breeder Focus

Here in the UK, we are lucky enough to be able to host a young breeder training weekend, every year. This weekend has been happening for generations. In 1997, Hugh Stevenson, a keen young breeder was tragically killed in a car accident at the age of 18. The Stevenson family, from the world known Bankend Ayrshires herd, created an award in Hugh's name to be presented every year to the young breeder achieving the most points over several competitions during the training weekend.

Here we catch up with three of our keen Young Breeders to find out what it has meant to them to be part of our Young Breeders programme.

Tell us about yourself!



Hello, I'm Scott Taylor.

I'm 26 and I work at home on the family farm. We farm 20 miles north of Aberdeen in the north east of Scotland and is home to the old mill Ayrshires. We run a herd of 240 cows being made up mixed breeds with

approximately 90 of them being Ayrshires. We calve all year round with the cows being grazed by day through the summer and TMR fed at night and through the winter. They also get fed to yield in the parlour.



Hi I am Megan Stratton, aged 21. I work at home on the Family Farm in Truro, Cornwall. The milking herd of 165 cows & 160 followers, all Pedigree Ayrshires. My Megarose herd started in 2011 when my grandparents

gifted me my foundation cow, Rosehill Bernie Magic. Now up to 24 head of cattle, my herd run alongside the Rosehill herd. My main roll on the farm is calf and young stock rearing. Outside the farm I am a keen member of Roche Young Farmers Club, where I am currently Secretary. I enjoy all aspects of YFC and I have represented my County at National finals in Stock judging, Floral Art, Recipe Awards, but a highlight was being named National Champions for Cookery in 2022, Cooking a "Posh" 4 course meal in an hour on 2 camping stoves.



Hi, I'm Ben Broadley from Buxton, in Derbyshire. I work at home with my dad, Andrew, and uncle Michael. We milk 160 cows under Whitecroft prefix along with a few of my own under my Whitepeak prefix. The herd is

grazed for as long as the weather allows in the summer and housed with a semi TMR in winter. I am also a keen member of Buxton YFC.

When did you first get involved with Ayrshire Young Breeders and why?

Scott - I attended my first young breeders' event when I was 15 (and haven't missed one since) I have always had a massive interest in Ayrshires, so it was an opportunity to see other herds of cows and speak with like-minded people.

Megan - I was very lucky as Cornwall & Southwest clubs were very good at arranging kids training days and events. I attended my first young breeders' event in 2007 in Derbyshire. I was only 5 at the time but I was included and let train alongside everyone else.

Ben – 2022, in Yorkshire was my first young breeders' weekend. I wanted to attend to meet new people with shared interests and to learn new skills across clipping, showmanship and bull mating.

What skills would you say you inherited from being an Ayrshire Young Breeder?

Scott - Through young breeders I have learned all I know about showing, from clipping, turning them out and through to handling. It has also helped me to develop my judging in the show ring and understand bull proofs.

Megan - The weekends have helped me to develop the skills I have learnt at home and at Club level, while being shown different tips and tricks. The weekend gives the members a platform to compare themselves and compete with fellow members of the same age and interests. Probably the biggest skill I have developed my confidence and conviction in myself and my skills. Within the competitions, the bull mating competition is an opportunity to discuss pedigrees and breeding and is a lifelong skill that we use daily within our own herds.

Now one of my favourite aspects is helping and encouraging the younger members the same way the previous generations helped me.





Ben – Despite only attending a few weekends, I feel I have gained valuable confidence in reason giving, especially when speaking in front of a group. Attending has also helped me understand the different criteria that is important when selecting your breeding programme.

Has visiting numerous Ayrshire herds during your time in Ayrshire Young Breeders allowed you to take ideas home and implement changes or given you the intention/wish to do so, and what are they?

Scott - From visiting herds, it has allowed me to see daughters of different bulls and cow families that I have then used at home. It has also highlighted the Ayrshires ability to run well on a grazing system and I wish to push further down that route.

Megan - I think the most important thing we learn as junior member, visiting all these different systems and herds up and down the county, is the versatility of the breed and how different bulls and genetics work within those systems. Which always conjures up different opinions and conversations amongst us. One suggestion I brought home from one weekend was cow brushes, they have been a massive hit with our girls!

Ben - Its always interesting learning about different management systems. There is always something to think about when you get home whether that be a bull you hadn't thought about using before or a different management or infrastructure idea.



Do you have a favourite AYB gathering you have attended and why?

Scott - My favourite AYB gatherings would be 2018 in Ayr, it was a great group of folk and we got to see a lot of cows! Last year's one in Dumfries is also a favourite where I won overall. I've enjoyed all the gatherings and always look forward to the next one.

Megan - My favourite AYB gathering would have to be Yorkshire in 2022, it was the first one after Covid and my first time attending "un-supervised". We formed a close group and had lots of interesting conversations about the cows, while enjoying seeing lots of herds. The awards ceremonies are always a great end to the weekend, but this one also included a video about Hugh Stevenson and the competition.

Ben - York 2022 as this was my first time attending. I made some great friends, saw some fantastic cows and even managed to win on my first time compeating!



What has been your highlight from your involvement over the years?

Scott - My highlight must be winning the Hugh Stevenson trophy in 2023 and getting to go on the world youth tour in Australia.

Megan - My Highlight from my involvement over the years is an easy one and will probably be one I will always remember! Cornwall, my home club, hosted in 2019. From the beginning I was involved in planning. It was a lot of hard work at home, halter breaking 22 calves for the clipping competition, I was very proud of the show we put on, but the highlight of the weekend will be winning the John Cochrane Trophy, rounding the weekend off with fellow Southwest member Jake Sayer winning the Hugh Stevenson.

Ben - Winning the Hugh Stevenson award was a great honour and it gave me the opportunity to spend 8 amazing weeks in the USA working with Palmyra Ayrshires both on their home farm and also experiencing World Dairy Expo in Madison helping them with their show team. Following this, I also got the opportunity to see another six other farms. A truly unforgettable experience.

What would be your message to any young person considering becoming a member?

Scott - If you've any interest in the Ayrshire breed or would like to learn about it then it's a great way to meet people and learn, giving you knowledge and friends for life.

Megan - Just have a go! No matter your age or skill level, we have something for everyone. We are all here to help! You'll meet some great people with similar interests and get numerous opportunities which branch from these weekends weather that be helping at shows, travelling and much more.

Ben - Give it a go. You never know where it might take you and you're guaranteed to have fun along the way.








Biddesden Ayrshires

Herd Size: 185 cows and heifers

Average yield: 6,770 litres 4.42% Fat 3.37% Protein

The herd was established in the 1930's when our parents tried several breeds and decided that Ayrshire milk tasted the best.

It is an autumn calving herd. The cows are paddock grazed in the summer and housed in the winter where they are fed a ration based on grass and maize silage. We now grow Lupins and these are added to the ration, replacing Soya.

In 2016 we were given Bailiffscourt Hortense to join our herd by the Dowager Marchioness of Normanby and we are hoping that her son Biddesden Hector will leave his stamp on the herd. His semen was released for sale in 2019 by Cattle Services (Ayr) Ltd.

Recently we have used Pam Ayrs Hawaiian, Blue Spruce Ringer and Pie X Raoul, and we are looking forward to Cuthill Towers Buster's daughters entering the herd this autumn.

Catriona Guinness and family and the Biddesden team look forward to welcoming delegates on the 1st July.



Lyner Ayrshires

The Lyner Herd was established in 1974 so this year we celebrate 50 years of pedigree Ayrshire cattle at Glubhole Farm. On the farm lives Courtney and Christine with their son Matthew, his wife Emma and their three girls Ruby, Evie & Lily. We have a relief milker one day a week and the rest is done by the family. We are tenant farmers on the Trebartha estate.

The farm has always been very much a family affair and having four sons, there was always plenty of hands to help with all the work. Now all grown up, each of the sons still have ties within the farming industry. Graham our eldest has always been keen on the machinery side of things so for many years he worked for a local contractor. Arthur and his wife Debbie took on a council farm locally and still have a few animals with the Lyner bloodline. Julian is very keen on the show side of things so is always happy to lend a hand with that and is often called upon when we need an extra pair of hands.

The reason we went into Ayrshires is that Courtney as a young man worked for Ninian Simpson as his herdsman to his Ayrshire herd and the love for Ayrshires began.

The farm is 200 acres of a grass feeding system only, our cows run on a mainly grass based diet with a medium concentrate input both at milking time and mixed through the feeder wagon. The herd is grazed from February/March time until October/November dependent on weather and ground conditions. We use a paddock grazing system.

We try to keep our herd as pure Ayrshire as possible; we value the longevity of the Ayrshire cow and aim to breed cows with good feet, legs and long-lasting udders and also cows that milk from a grazing based diet. Some of our oldest cows have lived to 15th lactations. We still milk through an old six abreast parlour but hopefully plans are in place to install a herringbone parlour.

We have around 140 cows with their followers. Within the herd we also run a small herd of pedigree dairy shorthorns and some pedigree jerseys, but the bulk of the herd is purebred 100% Ayrshire. We classify our cows regularly and are cows always classify well as VG's or Excellents.

Many bloodlines have shaped our herd from the greats of Brocklehill Harvest Gold and Happy Spirit and Plaskett Special Offer to more recent times, Pam Ayrs Hawaiian, Oblique and of course we had our own bull in the cattle services semen sales. Lyner Oblique Focus was from our strong Fairystory female bloodline. We also had another son from Fairystory bloodlines by Napier called Lyner Toystory that has some impressive heifers on the ground. Strong female lines have always been the Brandysnaps and Chocolate families that would go back many generations. The Festival family line that descended from the Trillian Festival has also left her mark.

We would like to increase the herd to around 200 cows, it depends if any more land becomes available on the estate. We have been selling in calf and bulling heifers privately and hopefully you will come across some of them when you visit Highgrove. We hope you enjoy your visit and enjoy the rest of your trip.

Rosehill Ayrshires

Colin and Jenny established the Rosehill herd in 1980 entirely from the Trevarno herd that Colins father formed and bred as farm manager in 1962 and was dispersed in 1980/81.

The family acquired a Cornwall Council tenancy 29/9/1981 which was just nine days before the dispersal sale.

The original herd was heavily influenced by Lessnessock bloodlines with 10 of the 26 foundation cows sired by Lessnessock Carnation.

The future would see two more moves to larger farms within the Council estate. The present holding at Trenerry is roughly 195 acres with a further 75 acres of summer grazing rented nearby.

The farm is all down to grass and the cows are fed on a simple grass/grass silage system. Winter sees two kgs 25% protein blend added in the wagon and a 18% concentrate from ForFarmers fed to yield in the parlour.

The herd currently contains 166 cows and 166 youngstock and average 7040kgs at 4.55% fat 3.41% protein. Breeding has always been heavily to Ayrshire for replacements and also producing stock for sale.

Colin's favourite bloodlines in the herd are many "but I will reduce my selection to just two.."

Dainty family: - this contains two branches, the D's and the M's. Most famously the Dolly's and the Magenta's. This is our most prolific family with eight bulls still active in the AI studs.

Valerie family: - all animals in the herd with V. which includes our two highest classified homebred cows, Black Velour Ex96 7e 4* 97863kg lifetime yield and Premier Verylight Ex95 5e

Favourite bloodlines in the breed; - Blackaddar Milkmaid. Her son Blackaddar Milk Machine and her grandson Blackaddar BB Kellogg appear in pedigrees of most of our herd and especially the most influential. Including R Magenta Ex 94 9e 9* 100tonne born in 1998 and still producing sons with plus 854kg milk, grand daughter of B Milk Machine. Rosehill Blackthorn Ex who has had 24 Ex daughters in our herd, son of B BB Kellogg.

Current semen use: -Cuthill Towers Majestic, Cuthill Towers Buster, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Ravenhill Revolver, Brieryside Magic, and Hilltown Yukon Delta.

Diversification we have been involved in BENNAMANN'S pilot scheme for methane capture from our covered slurry lagoon. Methane is then processed and stored for use as fuel for vehicles and generators, reducing the farm carbon footprint.

Future: - with our tenancy ending its term at the end of March 2025, the future relies on the success or not of the next generation in obtaining a tenancy.

Wroughton Ayrshires

In 1972, Mike and Rosemary Windel took over the tenancy of 59 acres at Whitehouse Farm near Swindon "with two cows, two kids, a dog and no money". Since then, Mike and Rosemary along with their son Russell have worked hard to build the world renowned Wroughton herd.

Mike is the third generation of his family to farm, and he got started with the help of his uncle who gave him cows and the use of his machinery in return for labour. From these cows, Mike built the herd up gradually alongside the purchase of heifers from Monty Stallard's sale and others purchased through Reading market. Mikes intention was always to build the farm up, so he took every opportunity to take on extra land as it came up and today the farm totals 130 acres at Whitehouse with a further 90 acres of grass keep rented close by.

Today the family milk 180 cows and rear around 150 followers and the milk is sold to Waitrose. The herd currently averages 7,300 litres at 4.41% BF and 3.37% Protein and a cell count of 77 on twice a day milking.

The main drive is to have a good margin over concentrate which is currently sitting at £2200 and one of the reasons the family keeps Ayrshires on the farm is because they admire the longevity, great legs and feet, and their grazing ability meaning he can stock them tighter, "they are more pretty than other breeds" says Rosemary. Mike has always been passionate about Ayrshires, "my father kept them, and it was the only breed of cow he ever wanted to milk".

The cows graze from April to November and are fed a total mixed ration in the winter that includes grass silage and a 22% blend. Cows are fed concentrates in the parlour and have access to out of parlour feeders. The dry cows are on a ration of grass silage, barley straw and pre calving rolls and pre calving they are moved onto 10kg of the milk cow ration plus ad lib barley straw which sees the herd have no issues with milk fever or displaced stomachs.


Calves are reared on milk powder and ad lib course mix and are weaned between 8-12 weeks and then moved onto an 18% concentrate with ad lib straw. At 5 months they move onto silage, chopped straw and concentrate up to being turned out once they are in calf.

Heifers get two chances of sexed semen and then they run with an Angus bull to sweep up. Cows are served to either Ayrshire or beef (Blue or Angus). Ayrshire sires in the flask at the moment are West Mossgiel Modern Reality, Ardmore Crown Napier, Plaskett Bruno, Wroughton Lord Winston, Whitecroft Panell, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, West Mossgiel Modern Reality to name a few.

Mikes favourite cow families are the Janet, Nina, and Alice families. The Alice family goes back to Wroughton Alice who produced 128 tonnes of milk which at the time, was a world record for a pure Ayrshire cow. Current favourite cows at the farm are Wroughton Hilda EX94 sired by Wroughton Lord Winston who is in her 9th lactation, Wroughton Mayflower EX92 who is a Haresfoot Panache daughter and is milking in her 5th lactation and her VG87 2 year old daughter Wroughton Mayflower 2 who is sired by Wroughton Lord Winston, as well as Wroughton Stripe VG89 who took Champion Ayrshire at the South West Dairy show in October.

At 75 years young, Mike has no plans of slowing down and still works full time on the farm alongside son Russell and one full time worker as well as running a full contractor service. Despite recent health challenges, Mikes passion to farm and breed Ayrshire cows is still as strong as ever, and the family look forward to showcasing their herd on Wednesday 3rd July.


Duchy Ayrshires

Duchy Home Farm is an 1100-acre organic mixed farm situated in the beautiful Cotswolds Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and has been farmed by Henry-James since April 2021. Prior to his arrival, His Majesty the King had the farmed the land organically since 1986. The herd was created soon after his arrival and has continued to develop into the strong, high yielding cows we have today.

The farm consists of 200 pedigree Ayrshire cows and 200 followers, as well as 400 acres of arable which is used either for milling or animal feed. We also have sheep and some rare breed suckler cows.

We strive to work harmoniously with nature and have established numerous areas across the farm creating a mosaic of habitats that not only benefit nature and soil health but also contribute to the farms viability.

Henry-James looks forward to welcoming delegates to view the Duchy herd on July 4th.



Hunnington Ayrshires

Hunnington Ayrshires were established in 1971 by Chris and Hazel Window, first generation tenant farmers. The couple moved to Horsepool Farm, a derelict farm with no facilities with their two young daughters Karen and Lisa. Chris Window had formally been a herdsman for the Late Lord Plumb for 17 years. The farm consists of 80 acres of grassland and a further 110 rented acres for silage and young stock. Chris and Hazel took the opportunity to buy the farm in 1982.

We run approximately 85 cows, averaging 7390kg, 4.0% fat and 3.30% protein.

Cows are grazed in the summer months and in the winter fed grass silage and 1.1 tonnes of concentrate in the parlour.

Within the herd today there are 36 classified 'excellent' cows.

Excellent 97 point - x1
Excellent 94 Point -x4
Excellent 92 Points -x2
Excellent 90 Points x11

Excellent 96 Point-x1 Excellent 93 Points -x10 Excellent 91 Points -x7

Over the years the Hunnington herd achieved many show successes at major shows with Champion and inter-breeds at European Dairy Event, the Royal, the Royal Welsh, Welsh

Dairy Show, Southwest Dairy show and the National Calf show. Hunnington breeding has been used with global success including bulls Hunnington Mandella, Hunnington Admiral, Hunnington Easelad, Hunnington Famous and Hunnington Fantasy.

Both Chris and his daughter Lisa have had the honour of judging extensively throughout the UK and also internationally in Australia, New Zealand and Finland.

After the sad loss of Chris Window in 2017, Hunnington Ayrshires is now managed by Lisa and her nephew Chris Window (Jr.). Hazel and Karen both support the business totally working mainly in the diversification side of the business.

The Window family have always retailed most of their milk, this business has continued to develop with Ayrshire milk in great demand. This has resulted in all the milk produced now being sold directly to the customer. We have also diversified the business further by running a successful dog-park business and caravan storage site.

This would have to be the Fragy family, also the Sailour Girl, Joybell and Easled families have had a major influence. These were among the original bloodlines brought to Hunnington. More recently the Bella's and Wren's are establishing themselves with great success.

Favourite bloodlines in the Ayrshire breed would have to be the Sandyford Clover and Mayflower family, however there are many strong family lines in the UK and abroad to admire and utilise.

Our breeding policy is to breed cows with style, capacity, quality udders and great mobility. We believe in using breeding from cow families with a great depth of pedigree. Established strong cow families are vitally important within the breed. Conformation is a very important factor for us, we like to breed cows that last and improve with age whilst utilizing a simple grazing system that satisfies not only our business but the cows and our customers.

Our future plans are always to improve in any way we can, and we will continue to breed the Ayrshire cow here at Hunnington. We all share a passion for showing the Ayrshire cow and will continue to do so whenever time allows. We are consistently modifying our business to ensure that the next generation has a successful herd and business to continue the legacy.

Beeline Ayrshires

The business was started from nothing by my mum and dad back in the 1950's in Leek, Staffordshire. We moved to Cheshire in 1973 by which time we had a flying herd of 120 cows, I joined the business after school and myself and Rachel took over completely in 1997. We were badly affected by TB with buying in replacements, so we decided to close the herd and breed our own. By this time we had some Ayrshire cows we had bought in and impressed by the way they performed it was decided this was the way to go, so, in 2009 the "Beeline" Ayrshire herd was formed.

The herd is run on very commercial lines and animals have to perform to stay. The herd is grazed in the summer on a paddock system and is fed a TMR in the winter months. Cows are housed in sand bedded free stalls and the youngstock bedded with straw. Yields have improved with the switch to sand and also when the new parlour was installed, which also cut down the waiting time. The parlour is a ATL 32/64 with two people milking and the herd is milked in 2-3 hours.

Breeding wise whilst we have pure Ayrshires the vast majority are hybrids, breeding is all down to AI and we are currently using Calcutta, Reynolds, Caesar, Revolver, Armageddon, Astorwell and Buster. We are lucky to have some good cow families and I will leave it up to you to pick out your favourite. I was asked to pick out a family in the Ayrshire breed I admire and this has to be the Ruth family from Palmyra, with Magic park Shady Maiden from Munden farms in Australia being a cow I also have great respect for.

Future plans are to look at solar panels and to increase production to 9000litres and pass on more responsibility to our son Rob and his wife Lizzy.

Heydale Ayrshires

The Ayrshires first arrived at Dale Head farm in 1950's from purchases from both Castle Douglas and Ayr markets. Around 50 years ago, Alf and his son Derek started registering the herd under the Heydale prefix.

In the search for more milk in the 70's, Alf and Derek purchased bulls from Jim Rennie's Pant herd, and these were used heavily until the late 80's.

Peter joined the business in 1982 when he left school and had the passion to keep moving the herd forward and taking teams to major shows including the Great Yorkshire and the National Ayrshire show. Peter began introducing genetics from all over the world from top cow families in the late 90's and continues to use international breeding today.

Two cow families you will see have been in the herd since the 60's, these are the Ovoid's and the Winsome's where some of the best Heydale breeding has come from including the well known Cattle Services bull, Heydale White Willow.

Other cow families to look out for are the Bronaras which were introduced to the herd from America, the S families all originate from the Normanton herd, the Model's came from Canada, The Ellas were purchased from Haresfoot, Ginny, Zinnias, Brown Kate and Big Kate and Glitter families were all from Pant. The Polly's, Daphne's, Helen's, Flox, Jean, Jay, Olga, Cushy and Moss Rose are all original families of the herd.

We have had some great results both inside and out of the ring with Heydale Summertime VG87 winning the 4yr olds and Heydale Ovoid 365 EX93 taking champion at the Great Yorkshire Show 2022. Heydale Progress Elaine won the 2yr old at the National Show at UK Dairy Day 2022 and we had our first ever All Britain and Ireland winners with Heydale Wingman Bronara VG86 winner of the 2 year olds (3rd in WAF photo comp) and Heydale Winsome 183 VG88 4 year old (3rd in WAF photo comp).

We have sold cattle that have gone on and done well for their new owners. Heydale Dream Bronara became 9th gen EX for the Smartmove Syndicate. Heydale Ovoid's have featured in the top prices at the recent Rhos Dispersal and Winsomes at the Sunshine Dispersal. And most recent sale Heydale Winsome 209 now VG87 went on to win her class at the RUAS Winter Fair 2022 and was 3rd all Britain 3yr old.

Bigginvale Ayrshires

The Adams family very much look forward to welcoming you.

Joanna, Richard, and Andrew are the third generation to farm at Shirley Old Park Farm, after Grandfather Ben moved here in 1950. Robert and Jennifer took over on his retirement and some years later in 1999 became organic, supplying milk to ORGANIC HERD, which is still the case today as the Ayrshire cow fits perfectly into their PWAB (produced without antibiotics) being such easy care, low maintenance and resilient cattle.

ORGANIC HERD are sponsoring the lunch at our visit on the 6th July and drinks for this are being sponsored by BLUE MERLE Natural Animal Health. At Bigginvale we are avid users of Homoeopathy, as a preventative for things such as Mastitis, foul, retained cleansings and in the young stock ringworm and pneumonia.

Today the farm extends to around 500 acres – mainly grass with around 30 acres of whole crop. Reseeding with red clover and rye grass leys using whole crop as a break crop. Aims are to increase the amount of over seeding to improve production of existing grazing leys.

The farm runs 150 milk cows producing an average of: 6677kg - 4.06BF, 3.31PR on a mainly grazing system, with turnout usually from Mother's Day to Bonfire Night.

Almost all calves are reared with surplus heifers being sold to other organic herds or Ayrshire breeders around the country, while the bull calves are castrated and run to 28 months and along with early lambs from 100 Dorset ewes go on to supply organic beef and lamb to Marks and Spencer's via Dawn Meats, Bridlington.

Favorite cow families are the White Julia's for their strong components, Blissfull's for type and Peg's for being general all-rounders.

The breeding aims are to improve components whilst trying to use outcross sires and continuing to maintain close to 100% pure herd. Jo uses sexed or conventional semen for two services then the Hereford bull thereafter to breed for higher fertility and maintain the rolling 73% conception rate to 1st service. In the flask we have lots of Cattle Services young bull semen and a good stock of older semen from herds like Hilltown and Stamford.

We are also strong believers in having a home bred bull or two around the place for use in block calving heifers spring and autumn usually. With a home bred bull half the genetics are known to work exceptionally well in our system and will go on to do brilliant things for other breeders. We sell quite a few into commercial herds looking to get some sound genetics into their herd.



Alongside this farm a 280 acre organic hill farm is run at Alstonefield, home to the Bigginvale herd of Belted Galloways and 300 April lambing ewes also supplying Dawn Meats.

Enjoy your dinner on the visit as it's produced by BIGGINVALE ORGANIC our slow maturing belted galloway's, producing fabulously marbled beef off rough grazing on a lot of conservation ground. We sell the majority of beef direct to customers, along with most of our spring lamb and April lambs' trough-out the year.

Whitecroft Ayrshires

Herd Size: 180 cows and heifers

Average yield: 7,8000 litres 4.40% Fat 3.40% Protein

Our current herd size is 180 with an average yield of 7800kg at 4.40% butterfat 3.40% protein and a calving interval of 387 days with 44% of the herd currently in their 1st lactation.

The first animals were registered under the Whitecroft prefix in 1982, after John Broadley (Dad) had joined the society as a member in 1971. Our favourite herd bloodline is the Nellie family due to their consistent type, fertility and quality production and the Punch's are also another of the favourite breed lines for much the same reason.

Current service sires are Ravenhill Revolver, Hilltown Yukon Delta, Des Coteaux Amazing, Plein Soleil Hunter and Stamford First Attraction through AI with the home bred bulls; Whitecroft Historian and Whitecroft Asterix also both used on farm as natural service.

The breeding policy has recently been tweaked due to the success of sexed semen and the top 25% are now served to the Ayrshire with sexed semen or conventional to open up new bloodlines with the rest going to the Aberdeen Angus.

Cows are grazed for as long as possible with turnout generally mid-late April and housing mid-late October though this is weather dependent at both ends, the winter ration is semi TMR topped up in the parlour with concentrates.

The farm sits at 1100ft on a limestone plateau in the heart of the Peak District National Park. With John and Barbara now retired the farm is run by brothers Andrew and Michael with fulltime help from Andrew's elder son Ben with one part time staff member and a relief milker.

All 250 acres are down to grass with very little or if possible, no artificial fertiliser used. Herbal seed mixtures are currently being stitched into the existing leys to help with palatability whilst grazing and in the silage, with the deeper root systems helping with the soil structure.

Tessvale Ayrshires

Tessvale Ayrshires began in 1997 with five heifers from Messrs Renshaw's Sapperton herd, Margaret and Shamrock being successful families. More purchases were made from Mr Little's dispersal sale near York, including cow families Julia, Whiterose, Nigh, Gladys and Baby. With these cows, we began farming a 30 acre Staffordshire County Council farm.

Cherryleaf, Cherryshine, Ester and Mary were added from Chris's father's Bigginvale herd. After only 12 months we moved to a larger 50 acre Council farm and rented additional land to support the cows, all youngstock and a flock of 150 ewes.

Very few cows have been purchased since except Damson from William Biggin, Quartz and Rum from Brian Moorhouse and Marie tracing back to Hitcham Marie. Always wanting to breed our own, semen was used from Cattle Services young bull list.

We also purchased three Holstein cows from J T Bunting, where Chris worked after leaving school for ten years - one successful family being Augusta which have been crossed with Ayrshires.

Tessvale became a closed herd in 2009 after taking a private tenancy of 280 acres at Great Gate where we are today.

Currently we milk 100 cows, we rear all youngstock, have a flock of 150 ewes and grow 30 acres of corn. Heifers are reared to calving and bull calves fattened intensively sold direct to Dunbia or livestock auctions.

We believe Ayrshire cows should be a low maintenance animal, ours are kept on a simple system grazed for as long as possible, fed silage with a kilo of cereal in the feed trough and a blend in the parlour to a maximum of 5kg per day. With these low maintenance cows there have been no routine vet visits, fertility treatments or dry cow therapies used for 23 years.

Cuthill Towers

The Lawrie Family would like to welcome you along to Cuthill Towers on Saturday 13th July. The family have registered Ayrshire cows since 1886 and the Cuthill Towers herd was established in 1954. We moved into the new farm shed in 2006 and are currently milking 270 cows 3X a day. The herd is currently averaging 10230kg, Fat 4.10% and Protein 3.40%. We farm 600 acres over two farms and rent a further 100 acres. Cows are housed all year round and are fed on a TMR system, with 5 cuts of silage taken. Barley, wheat and beans are also grown to feed stock.

We introduced red and white breeding into the herd over 20 years ago and continue to use it in our breeding program.

We have had a few bulls go onto stud over the years with the most recent being Cuthill Towers Buster and Calcutta. Cuthill Towers Rhino has just arrived onto stud and we look forward to seeing his offspring in the future.

Some of our strongest cow families are Barbara, Blossom, Magenta, Mandy, Marcy, Miss Blondie, Ray and Swan.

Of the official highest Ayrshire producers in 2023, ranked on combined Fat and Protein, we had 4 of the top 5 animal in the breed

We show at many of the local and national shows and have had great success over the years with one of the most recent being Cuthill Towers Modern Marcy Ex94(2) winning the Interbreed at the Royal Highland show in 2022.

Here at Myremill Farm we are farming a total of 500 acres of which 250 acres are for grazing and grass silage, 150 acres Wheat/Spring Barley and 100 acres Maize Silage. We run AYR calving, 3x a day milking through a GEA 30:30 Rapid Exit Palour.

Cows are fed on a TMR Diet and fed to yield through the Palour. The current ration consists of Molasses, Caustic Wheat, Soya Rape mix, Amino Max (Heat treated rape) and a 50/50 mix of grass silage and maize silage.

Brieryside Ayrshires are the oldest prefix still registering animals in the UK today with pedigrees dating back to the early 1900s. We are now in our 4th generation of Ayrshire Breeders, and this is the main driver for keeping Ayrshires today.

Over the next 10 years we plan to concentrate on our best Ayrshire breeding lines with the use of the most elite AI Bulls available which have a combination of high type and positive production. We also plan to develop our Holstein herd under the Arranview Prefix which is a 100% genomic tested herd focusing on a custom index which combines high conformation, positive production, and positive fertility.



Cottown Ayrshires

The Cottown Pedigree Ayrshire Herd is based just outside Bangor, at the top of the Ards Peninsula, 15 miles from Belfast, the Capital of Northern Ireland. It is a family run farm, with John, Jean and sons Andrew and Peter working on the farm. We first started registering in 1999 when Peter started grading up a number of Ayrshires that we had in our commercial herd.

The herd currently consists of 200 milkers being milked on 3 Lely robots. with a herd average of 8000 litres at 4.40% butterfat and 3.40% protein. Cows are grazed from early April to mid-October, with a diet feeder buffer available within the shed while being milked at robots. In winter, the cows are housed, and diet fed, with concentrate topped up through robots all year round.

Our first 2 lely A4 robots were purchased and started operating in November 2011 with a new A5 being installed in 2022. Along with the milking robots we have a Lely Juno to push forward feed to the cows at the feed barrier.

The majority of breeding is AI to sexed semen, currently using sires Pie x Lucky, Beechmount Magic Mike, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Plein Soleil Hacker, Ravenhill Revolver and VR Uppura all sexed. The lower end of the herd is served by either Beef Shorthorn or Aberdeen Angus beef bulls. A batch of the best heifers is served using a stock bull, this year being Cottown King Charles, a Hunter son from Peters favourite cow family, the Claire's. Peter believes in using a wide range of worldwide genetics to keep the genetic pool within our herd as large as possible.

Future plans will be based around improving efficiency in milk production from the herd, through better breeding and feeding and any possible use of technology that will reduce the labour requirements on farm.

Running alongside the dairy herd is the Bratlach Clydesdale Stud, consisting of 6 breeding mares and 2 stallions with youngstock.

Ardmore Ayrshires

The Ardmore Prefix was established in 1965 by the Hunter family who are no strangers to the showing circuit with 14 championship titles to their name at the Royal Ulster Winter Fair. The family also won the McClarnin interbreed championship in 2017. This consists of the champion and reserve champions at eight local shows. They won this with Sandyford Honest Blizzard who to date, is the only Ayrshire to ever win the title. Blizzard also went on to win the World Ayrshire Photographic competition in the same year.

Ardmore currently extends over 200 acres with a further 100 acres taken in conacre with 180 milking cows plus followers, roughly one third of the herd are Holsteins.

The milking herd is currently averaging 7500lts at 4.3% fat and 3.3 protein. They are group managed and fed a TMR mix.

Alongside the cows, they also have a small flock of pedigree Blue Faced Leicester sheep.

The family's favorite bloodline in the herd are the Janets and the Orphans whilst admiring some of the Sandy Rose families from other breeders. Another strong family admired is the Clovers from Sandyford. John and Michael have been investing in new bloodlines over the past few years from Cuthill Towers, Sandyford, Middle, Brieryside, Carnell, Knowe and Barr.

Sires that are currently being used on farm are Ravenhill Revolver, Blue Spruce Ringer, Carnell Resolution, Troutbeck Daring, Palmyre Berkley Reagan, Palmyra Lochinvar Reynolds, Cuthill Towers Calcutta, Sandyford Unbeatable.

Michael has admired the Ayrshires from a young age, seeing many great cows in his young farmer days, especially at Ian Duncan's of Lennymore where the Janet and Orphan families came from.



Ravenhill Ayrshires

The Ravenhill Ayrshire herd consists of approximately 120 cows and followers of which 44 are currently classified excellent.

Cows are housed approximately 6 months of the year and grazed in the summer, with a herd average of 8221@4.27 and 3.40.

A bull from the herd, Ravenhill Revolver currently has semen available from Cattle Services. His Dam is Cochrane's Revolution Present whose dam in turn we were lucky to get from John Cochrane.

Current service sires being used are Ravenhill Showstar and Ravenhill Revolver, plus Calcutta and Buster, Ringer, Daring and Hawaiian.

Heifers entering the herd at present are mainly by Showstar, Oblique Focus, Hawaiian and Wind in the Willows.

USA

So many changes and so many things have happened since our last World Avrshire Federation Conference and Tour! We completed an amazing session in Australia only to find ourselves and the world upset by a virus so defining we view ourselves as before and after COVID. As in true Ayrshire fashion our breeders both domestically



and internationally continued to thrive and promote our incredible breed.

Here in the US, we adapted and performed many of our tasks and events virtually. Our juniors were especially active and had wonderful growth during this time doing photo contests, trivia, scavenger hunts and many other innovative programs to keep them engaged and involved.

We continue to benefit from those programs even though we have moved to actual events. We put huge emphasis on our youth programs which serve the 9-21 year age group and have always had strong support from advisors and committee members. We transitioned into an ambassador program that allows both male and female contestants to via for the opportunity to represent Ayrshire at many national events. We have art, advertising, poster, Jeopardy and Diary Bowl knowledge contests for all commers as well as Junior All-American, production and Excellent cow recognitions. Wouldn't it be fun to qualify again and participate.

Our programs saw little decline during COVID and have essentially retained our normal participation. Our bundled Rewards program continues to attract breeders who would like to take advantage of all programs at a reduced fee. We find that over 65% of our classifications and nearly that for registrations come through our Rewards herds. Our classification program saw a change that was economically based in 2023. We moved from a small breed group program to having US Holstein administer the on-farm evaluations. Our scale and breed specific data remain the same. We initiated a few required programs that benefit valid identity and genetic abnormalities as well as add more data to the genomic base.

Recently we realized a change in our office administration and are already seeing benefits that will continue to move our Association forward. We have developed a strong, respected place in the purebred dairy industry in the US and we are constantly finding more buyers from other breeds choosing Ayrshires. Currently most sales in the US have become diverse and are including Ayrshires in their offerings and the prices the sellers net are significant. Since our last meeting we have had a world record price for an Ayrshire cow sold at auction. It is very gratifying to look at a buyers list for cattle and embryos and see buyer's names that are nationally recognized for other breeds. Looking through major dairy magazines you will find Ayrshires mentioned in many farm advertisements. We have worked very hard for many, many years to gain this type of recognition that our Ayrshires deserve.

The future will see more changes, it is inevitable, but US Ayrshire is determined to work through these changes, and we are determined to have our positive impact continue.

New Zealand

The Avrshire New Zealand Annual Conference is fast approaching in June, taking place in Waikato region. Members attending will enjoy the annual Awards Night celebrating success; herd visits including an organic farm; and a visit to the famed Cambridge Stud, home of internationally renowned New Zealand racehorses Sir Tristram and Zabeel.

Membership in Ayrshire New Zealand continues a five-year increase, currently sitting at 311 members. We are proud that in New Zealand, Ayrshires hold the highest percentage of registrations in comparison to the national herd, and often outnumber other breeds at A&P Shows despite making up only 1% of the national herd. Our membership is strong and active.

Nowhere is this more evident than our flagship competitions. The AgriSea All New Zealand Photo Competition covers nine classes and attracts over 110 entries annually. The Graeme Knight Memorial Trophy is presented to the overall Judges Choice. The Ayrshire On Farm Competition is only a few years old, but numbers continue to increase annually at well over 350 animals now judged on-farm nationwide. With regional finalists already named, members are looking forward to the final results which will be announced at the upcoming Annual Conference.

The Ayrshire Bulletin (bi-annual magazine) continues to attract strong support from members, and the Association has enjoyed launching a new website this year www.ayrshire.org.nz.


The top production herd for the 2022/23 season was the Goldwyn Ayrshires herd of Bryan & Lynley Hayward, Putaruru and they will be presented with the Mayfield Trophy. This herd of 90 pedigree Ayrshires averaged 8,015 litres milk, 322 kg fat, 278 kg protein, 600 kg milksolids in 288 days. Under New Zealand's pastoral system, the 2023/24 season will finish at the end of May.

In the 2023/24 season, after several years of Mycoplasma Bovis and then COVID lockdowns, Ayrshire New Zealand members exhibited at several major shows in New Zealand. It is great to see the major honours spread across several members.

Ayrshire New Zealand continues to support youth members through several competitions and programmes. In 2023 we sponsored Charlotte Stachurski of Balmaine Ayrshires (Taranaki) to represent New Zealand at the International Youth Tour held in Australia. Youth members compete in breed handling competitions in two age group classes at the North & South Island Championships; and in the Arran Trophy for the Ayrshire Young Judge Competition at NZ Dairy Event, also representing Ayrshire New Zealand in the World Wide Sires All Breeds Young Judge Competition. The Ayrshire Young Breeders Heifer Competition focusses on youth selecting a two-year-old heifer to follow for a season; and the Ayrshire Young Breeders Seminar has just concluded in the Nelson/Collingwood area. Youth members also take part in all breeds activities such as the National All Breeds Youth Camp; and the International Dairy Week Youth Challenge in Australia.

The Association's marketing arm, Semayr Breeding Services, continues to attract support from members and farmers. With genomics now in use in the Ayrshire breed in New Zealand, this year's catalogue features six proven and five unproven bulls, along with three sires imported from Scandinavia.

Australia

We've always known it, but Australia is the lucky country! We hosted a very successful WAF Conference Tour in January 2020, prior to Covid sweeping the world. Overseas delegates experienced a tour of three states, including farm visits interspersed with sight-seeing of our wildlife, places of interest and culture - and enjoying the Ayrshire judging at our International Dairy Week Show. The memories of this tour are still talked about by our members four years on!

The 2023 World Ayrshire Federation (WAF) Youth Tour in Australia was held late August/early September commencing from Melbourne with a tour of Victorian Ayrshire farms, travelling through the southeast of South Australia, visiting more Ayrshire farms, and culminating at the Royal Adelaide Show. The eight youth from Ayrshire member countries, having been 'delegated' to exhibitors assisted with preparing animals for the show ring, sharing their knowledge and gaining additional learning from their experiences. Whilst at the Show, the youth participated in specific Youth Tour competitions: clipping, leading and judging, which the Australian Ayrshires Federal Committee scheduled. Each competition was well received, with first - third places awarded, and an overall Champion, Reserve and Honourable Mention trophies were awarded during the Youth Tour farewell gathering. The tour participants had the opportunity to experience Australian farming and showing practices and have taken home some very fond memories of their trip 'down under'. Greg Edmonds (host/tour bus driver), Andrew Gray (host), and Imogen Steiner (hostess), and Royal Adelaide Show exhibitors ensured the participants were provided an unforgettable experience.

In 2022, we held our inaugural National On Farm Challenge Competition. Entries were accepted from the Champions from each state competition, with the judging adopting a 'virtual' format of a short video of the cattle. National Juvenile, Intermediate and Senior champions are selected by an independent judge, and owners presented with a trophy recognising the awards at our annual national dinner during our International Dairy Week.

Our breed was recognised during the 2023 International Dairy Week Show, with the Ayrshire entry of Paschendaele Klassy Tri Time, exhibited by Eagles Partnership and Munden Farms being awarded Intermediate Champion Interbreeds and Australian Grand Champion of Show, having previously won the Intermediate Champion, Best Udder, Supreme Ayrshire Exhibit and Champion Exhibit of the Ayrshire Show.

In 2024, the Federal Committee re-introduced the Star Brood Cow Award to recognise cows who have contributed to the breed through their progeny, and the Superior Cow Award to recognise cows with high classification and productive capabilities that maintain their functional type over an extended lifetime. These awards are designed to recognise the advancement managed by breeders developing Ayrshire breeding and genetic improvements in our herds.

David Mayo (Regal Park Ayrshires) was presented with Federal Life Membership of Australian Ayrshires at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2024, where David exhibited. Life membership was awarded to David in recognition of his tremendous contribution and service to the Ayrshire breed in Australia and worldwide over the years.



Finland

Milkrecording records of Finnish Ayrshire were outstanding in 2023. The average yield of the Finnish Ayrshire cows was 9291 kg milk, 425 kg fat, 343 kg protein and 4.57 % fat, 3.69 % protein. The lifetime yield 24.359 kg milk and lifetime yield of culled cows 31.877 kg milk. Average lactation number of alive cows was 2.84 and culled cows 3.49 years. Ayrsihre cows which were alive in the end of the year 2023 had daily yield of energy corrected milk 15,5 kg. Those cows which were culled in year 2023 had daily yield of energy corrected milk cows 17.0 kg. Fertility statistics tells that average calving interval was 403 days and inseminations per calving was 1.93.

According to health recording the number of veterinary treatments was 69.1 for Ayrshire cows and the same KPI for Holstein cows was 90,6. Most common treatment for Ayrshire cows was done because of fertility problems. Cell account was 191 000.

Very first Finnish Ayrshire cows are now on the farms which have CFIT system developed by VikingGenetics. Those CFIT systems are on the research farm of LUKE in Jokioinen and on the private farm in Kiuruvesi. CFIT is the system which make it possible to collect data of amount of feed eaten by cows. The Finnish farmers are respected Ayrshire for many traits for example its better health in many ways.

South Africa

Current situation - The dairy industry currently is experiencing a lot of strain on profitability and there are a few factors that have an influence. In South Africa there are a lot of challenges for example we have load shedding mostly every day. The supply of electricity (power) is not efficient and cannot supply our current demand; this is a huge challenge for the dairy farmer if you have 4-6 hours of no supply each day. Not only are dairy farmers taking the strain but the rest of South Africa as well, it makes it more challenging for any operation or business to be fully operational and functional . At least our situation led to a greener South Africa because a lot of business was forced to expand and install solar systems. The northern parts of SA, that is our main supply for white maize, experienced a very dry summer rainfall and this concluded to a shortage of over 3 million tons of maize production. The situation had an effect on a higher maize price and the dairy farmer that have TMR herd would eventually face a higher input cost.

The Ayrshire market is a niche market and makes out a small portion of the total volume of milk supplied in SA. Currently we supply Woolworths with 70 million litres annually between the few registered Avrshire farms that is still sustainable. Our product gets marketed and sold as "Ayrshire" throughout all Woolworths retail

In the late 1990s, the exceptional smooth taste of Ayrshire milk caught the attention of Mark Spencer, a prominent supermarket chain, leading to Ayrshire products in Woolworth's stores.

This is still a successful strategy for an outstanding 30 years of marketing our Ayrshire milk in the Woolworths stores, thanks to all the previous pioneers that started this exclusive line in a world class retail store.

The Ayrshire society currently has 7 board members and 2 employees. Edmund Els is running our field work and Olene runs the office, Olene is employed for 37 years at the society and does a good job to keep everything running. The Ayrshire society strive for pure genetics. The society still subsidise the breeders on genomic testing for a 1000 animals per year, the amount does differ according to the financial situation of the society

Our top 5 biggest registered Ayrshire herds consist out of the following 5 herds

Anton Homsek - 2156 Vickers Farming - 1612 Fairfield Dairies - 1510 Huguenot Farms - 1357 Rhodes Food Group - 1100

The highest lifetime production cow produced 105 912 kg of milk over 11 lactations, she is bred and owned by Jan Wessels.



Canada

For Ayrshire Canada, it is undeniable that this breed possesses competitive and lucrative potential, regardless of its environment. However, it is imperative that all genetic data generated by breeders be accessible and utilized to enhance the reliability of genetic evaluations. These data should benefit all Ayrshire breeders in each of our countries.

The new practices aimed at reducing the number of replacement heifers by selecting only genetically superior females from herds are now widely adopted. This management principle relies on adequate availability of sexed bull semen and the reliability of genetic indices. However, for our breeders, these two aforementioned aspects often lack, thereby impairing our herds.

Genetic progress made over the past 5 years is significantly comparable to that of other major Canadian breeds. The national average production over 305 days stands at 8420 kg of milk, with 349 kg of fat (4.16%) and 287 kg of protein (3.42%), for a BCA of 244-245-253. In terms of mature equivalent, this translates to 9755 kg of milk, 397 kg of fat, and 332 kg of protein.

The breed improvement committee has set a goal to increase fat production by 46kg/cow/lactation within the next 5 years. All of this, without neglecting other criteria of production, conformation, and health. This goal is ambitious but realistic provided we remain vigilant in management.

Following the observation of numerous herds underperforming relative to their genetic potential, the association has decided to invest efforts in raising awareness and providing information to breeders on the importance of properly balancing feed rations and ensuring adequate metabolizable protein. Already, several breeders have made changes, and the results are tangible: higher lactation peaks and better lactation persistence are observed. As a result, production increases, animal body condition improves, health issues decrease, and profitability grows.

Over the past 12 months, the average classification score for firstlactation cows has been 80.6 points. The scoring components are allocated as follows: 40% for the Mammary System, 10% for the Rump, 25% for Feet and Legs, and 25% for Dairy Strength. Additionally, an animal's final score is influenced by factors such as the Age at First Calving and the stage of lactation. In 2023, more than 3,000 first-lactation cows voluntarily underwent classification each year.

It's not a novelty, but in recent years, our businesses have been subjected to increasing financial pressure. To cope with this, our farms must be competitive, meet market demands, and face competition. There's no doubt that our breed possesses all the necessary qualities to endure over time, provided we fully exploit its potential and take pride in it. 
